David R. Dresia David R. Dresia, age 77, passed away October 24, 2019 in New York City. He was born November 8, 1941 in Covina, California and was raised in San Rafael, and was a Class of 1959 graduate of San Rafael High School. David graduated from UCSanta Barbara. He went to Infantry Officers Candidate School in Fort Benning, GA where he was commissioned lieutenant. He served in Vietnam in 1966 and 1967 where he saw combat.
