(8) Unit cmdrs will strike all tents in their unit area on the morning of 4 Nov . Tents will be neatly folded and placed on the cement block. Poles and pins will be neatly alignod with the tents.
(9) Company commanders will report accomplishment of the above to the Bn XO NLT 1600 hours 3 November 1970。 (With the exception of item \#8,)
