SUBJECT: Daily SITREP 192 for 140001 H May to 142400H May 70.

1. (C) Operations Summary

A. The 1/12 Inf conducts search and destroy ops in assigned AO from FSB COMMANCHE under the operational control of the 1st Bde.

(1) Co A chops to the 3/506th Abn Inf. A Co found 5 large hootches; a rifle range; six 82mm rds; one 51 cal barrell; documents; 12 oil drums; hospital complex(20 hootches); 20-30 cases of medical supplies. US losses were 2 KIA and 6 WIA. Enemy losses were 20-25 enemy KIA and WIA, no body count was possible because the company was not able to sweep the KEL. Refer After Action Report.

(2) Co B swept their assigned AO with the following results: vic YA457648 found one NVA green fatigue shirt covered with blood, fresh within the last 24H. One bag of flashlight batteries. Also found a rope bridge 40' long across a stream, used to sling equipment across the stream.. Inside the shirt was a claymore bag containing Timex watch, and plastic bags containing company size rosters, 25 names, rank and serial number, passes to base camp that are signed and stamped, pictures of man's family in a wallet, diary type notebook; indiv believed to be first sergeant.

(3) Co C swept their assigned AO with neg significant findings,

(4) Co D remained at FSB for security and perimeter defense.

(5) Recon cont screening mission.

US losses: 47 WIA; 15 KIA.

Fdly losses: 1 KCS WIA.

US inflicted enemy losses: 18 enemy KIA, (BC); 19 S/A CIA; 4 Chicom field
