Friends and fellow Warriors -- I am going to attached a letter to share, that I wrote to then Chaplain Max Wilk, 1/12 IN 4th ID.

Sometime around late February to early March 1967, Max had flown into an LZ that we in C/1/12 had occupied. Chaplain Wilk did visit the men in the field as often as possible. He later retired from the US Army as a Colonel, lived in Colorado Springs for years, but moved to Kansas City several years ago to be closer to family.

I wrote this letter to Max, while

he was in the hospital recovering from injuries he sustained when his Huey crashed into our LZ. The rotor blade hit a tree and crashed. The Huey landed on top of him, and the men of C Co helped lift the Huey off him. All the while he is yelling "No Smoking!! JP fuel leaking everywhere," and it was leaking on HIM!

He had hurt his back and was evacuated and he never returned to the 1/12. I saw him later, while stationed at Ft Leavenworth, KS. He attended several of our reunions, but his health finally stopped him from attending. He had saved a letter that I had wrote to him,

and later returned this letter to me, thinking I might like to have for my family. Hope you enjoy.

Obviously at the time that i wrote this, I and some others were frustrated with the new Bn S-3, a Special Forces Captain that thought he knew everything. I finally got so upset, I challenged him to a fight. He was so arrogant and would talk down to everyone. After LTC Lay went to become the Division G-3, the Bde XO-- LTC Wilcox became the Bn CO, he lasted about 1 month, he was replaced for the next 6 weeks or so, by the Bde S-3, don't remember much about him. Then LTC Wright became the CO.

I just thought that maybe some of you would enjoy remembering and reading, even though i did reflect on some of my frustrations at the time.

Many one still going puetly good, and we have had lettle or no contact in the last 2 weeks. I will lowing you up to date on some sother action. On 16 Fai March - B Co conductor a CA into an LZ (Newsulan they long , leig, LZ about 10 Kms South of 3T) and was hit, they fought for about 4-5 hours, talking 10 VC, they did a good joh. We (((a) closed in later and that night got montaned by the had

guy, me suffered dight casualities, no one hilled. The 17th we moved out to Ignal the anoung moston position - which we bid and found all kinds of goodies. We moved out a little further and come to on all LZ of the 1/14, here Cpt Quan flew in an H-23 to gick up one habit moved 100 m/ ord slam, bem, crom, boon - Charlie was waiting. But did "Changin Chanlie" sunprise thour. I mannered my platoons here and there and after 5 hours of touse fighting me Acilled II NUA (Zej which were CHINESS and me suffered 2 1610 (TUCKER & CHUNGES) and 5 with (all OK now). They were Lighting from ald American bunkers and me were in the open - Terrain was wide opento be horest when those rounds were zipping

over my head I was just a little nervous anyway I was very proud of my men and sessione did an exallent joh, I get in 27 awards - 4 silver stars - 15 B.S. and & ACH w/ V - d get in Lt Jaming and Lt Bulgarie for the S.S. w/ T, they neally deal a fine jeh. Since that time we have had no cortact what so - even. The Recon photoon also was windowed is a fight the same day. They did a mal fine joh - Killing about 5NDA, but 5/5gt Kaneko was helled and SEC Shaffer was unueded, and with Set Ray. Me letter two are fine now. It Williams did a fine job. Cet Toggs has returned to A Co and feeling just fine. Et Sheaven is still doing a tremendour yel with B G and Lon is liaving his problems had in the Brave Charlie. 1 St Set Peneda will be leaving me soon , as I approved his 1049 and

he is awaiting transferred to ligs. Co. IFFV in WHA TRANG, le lesernes the change and him happy for him. plan to put SEC Cattagay as the new /set. I thank you for all you tid for me Max, you were a tremendous influence on my want and habits and my changes in attitude. You will be souly wined my friend by all in this hattalian, way Hod Bless you Max, and remember doit do the truist for amtile. Thank-you for the Easter menage, it was appreciated well Hay, this letter has dragged on , but I always liked talking to you, please write when you can I will always conjoy your letters, and I will to my hast its answer: my head way-way down - Ed.
