SUBJECT: After Action Report of Casualties Resulting from Friendly Mortar TFire

TO: Whom It May Concern

- 1. The 2d Bde, 4th Infantry Division initiated combat operations in the Eastern portion of BASE AREA 226, on 19 August 1970. The 1st Bn, 12th Infantry a part of this force was positioned in the northern portion of the 2d Bde AO and conducted search and destroy operations, with emphasis on interdicting enemy movement in the Suoi Ca Valley.
- 2. On 22 Sept 1970, FRAG CRDER 14-70, HQ's 1-12 Inf, caused the Battalion to reposition its forces in the Eastern portion of B A 226, astride the Suci CA River, with the mission of interdicting enemy movement in the Suci Ca Valley. On 23 Sept 70, Co A was ordered to move a platoon sized element to VIC COCRD BR819697, with the mission of performing saturation patrolling in that area.
- 3. a. At approximately 1755 hours 23 Sept 70, in the vicinity of Coord BR819697, the 1st Platoon of Company A, 1-12th Inf, received fifteen(15) rounds of mortar fire on their position. LT Williams, platoon leader of the 1st platoon of Co A, reported that the mortar fire was coming from the northeast on an azimuth of 50 degrees. The incoming mortar rounds started at 1755 hours and ended at approximately 1805 hours.
- b. As a result of this incident, 1st platoon, Co A, 1st Bn, 12th Inf, sustained seven(7) casualties. Two KIA's and five(5) WIA's. A dustoff for the casualties was initiated and dustoff 21 evacuated five WIA's at 1828 hours.
- c. At 1837 hours, 1-12 Inf received gunships, (GLADIATOR 17), and the gunships expended vicinity BR825705. A request for locations of friendly troops to the east of the Battalion Area of Operations, was made at 1815 hours, to 2d Bde S3, and received the location of Patrol Base Washington at BR841696.
- d. The S3 of 2d Brigade informed the Battalion S3 at 1815 hours, that all friendlies in the Area of Operations had checked fire and requested that we do the same. The 1st Bn, 12th Inf checked fire at 1818 hours. The 2d Brigade Commander(Col Culim) and the Bn Cmdr of the 1-12th Inf(LTC Harris) moved to the area of the incident and landed. Col Culim dispatched his HU-ID(Blackjack 18) to LZ UPLIFT with two KIA's(1905 hours).

- e. At 1920 hours HQ's 2d Bde, requested that we attempt to locate a tail? fin from the incoming mortar rounds. LTC Harris and LT Parish (FSCO(RD), Co B, 42d arty, performed a crater analysis, at the site of the incident, and determined that the mortar rounds were US type, Slmm, and that the mortar rounds came from the direction of Patrol Base Washington.
- f. The Platoon Leader of the 1st Platoon of Co A, 1-12th Inf(LT Williams) performed a resection, and determined his position to be at COORD BR819697. LT Parish received information from his chain of command that the unit occupying Patrol Base Washington was Co E, 3d Bn, 503d Inf, 173d Airborne Division, and that 4.2" mortars and 81mm mortars are located at the Patrol Base.
- g. LTC Arthur M. Harris, Commanding Officer of the 1st Bn, 12th Infantry requested that an investigating officer be appointed, who is not a member of the 4th Inf Div, or the 173d Abn Bde, to ascertain responsibility for the incident.

35/31(1/A) at VEC 819697, received 15 rounds of ordnance on their position at approximately 1755, 23 Sept 70. Leader on the ground stated that the firing was coming from the NORTHEAST on about a 50 degrees AZ. Rounds started landing at 1755H and ended at 1805H(approximately).

Seven casualties were received in the 35/31(1/A). Five were dusted off by Dustoff 21.

At 1800H, we requested gunships and received them at 1837H(GLADIATOR 17). GLADIATOR 17 expended 1 kilometer to the northeast of location of 35/31(1/A) on a 50 degrees AZ.

At 1815H, 2d Bde told us that all friendlies checked fire and told us to check fire also. 1/12 checked fire at 1818H(1-12 initiated fire at 1812H).

Also at 1815H, we requested MISSICN O locations of friendlies to the east. At 1826H, we received the location of PB WASHINGTON at VEC 841696.

At 1820H, we requested LOH for LTC Harris at 1825H. Neg tive LOH available. Dustoff 21 was on station at 1810H and completed dustoff at 1828H.

At 1835H, requested flareship (GLADIATCR 27 on station at 1923H).

MISSION 88, Col Culim, evacuated two(2) KIA's (with BLACKJACK 18) when Mission 88 landed at 35/31(1/A) location. He landed at 1905H.

At 1920H, 2d Bde requested for our 35/31(1/A) to look for the tail fin of the incoming ordnance - MSG passed to 35/31(1/A).
