- 1. (C) Operations Summary
- A. The 1/12 Inf cont opn PUTNAM SHARK, NW of Camp RADCLIFF.
- (1) A Co maintained FSB security with morning and evening local security sweeps, IP's and 1 ambush. Reports neg significant sightings or contacts.
- (2) B Co cont RIF in area bounded by checkpoints 350550, 370555, 350540, 370540. At 358552, B Co found 14 hootches 8x6x6' in an oval pattern; each hootch had a bunker next to it 5x6x4' with 12' 0/H, several had trenches adjoining the bunkers. The area was large enough for 75 indiv. Misc items were also found in the area, (baskets; knife; crossbow; etc). 1/B at 353546 found 3 graves 1 year old, 1 bundle of corn 2 weeks old. At 353548, they found 8 bunkers 6x8x4 with $1\frac{1}{2}$ 0/H, 6 mo old used by 4-6 indiv, 5-8 days ago. Two potato fields were adjacent to the bunkers. 2/B at 356551 found 2 OP positions 7' off the ground in a tree. They were 6 mo old; also found 1 hootch 4x5' with 3 tunnels not recently used and a bunker 5x12x5' built 4 days ago with neg 0/H. B Co vic 356549 was taking resupply when the helicopter took 7-8 rds S/A fire from 150m NE of LZ. One of the door gunners was WIA. 2/B swept toward the SEL. At 1645H 2/B engaged 1 enemy 75m NW, recieving enemy fire in return. 2/B cont toward the SEL. At 1712H a large hootch was discovered with fresh Ho Chi Minh sandal prints. Further search of the area produced a total of 15 hootches 10x8x5' in a gulley running N-S. R/L was employed in the area as a blocking force as B Co(-) moved into the area. Hootches were destroyed.

- (3) C Go cont RIF along checkpoints 297543, 301543, 302553, 297567, 297577.

 2/C(-) at 288546 found a hootch 6x8x5' used by 3 people 2 days ago, (dest). In the hootch 1 bag of human hair was found. 1/C(-) at 288550 found 1 bamboo water line 2" in diameter, 250' long leading from a stream to 1 hootch 10x10x6' and a bunker 6x4x4'; 1½' 0/H; 1½ weeks old used by an unknown number of people in the last 24H. 3/C at 295541 found 1 hootch 10x8x6'; 8 bunkers 10x6x4', 1 year old, last used 24H ago, (dest). In the vic 286553 found 3 graves w/ 3x5x3' hootches over them, 6 mo old, and no recent use. 1/C at 285554 found 1 hootch 10x4x6', 6 mo old, used 1-2 days ago. Imside was 1 NVA poncho; 1 empty 30 rd AK magazine; 1MG clip 5-6" in diameter, 1 unidentified mortar rd, 2" in dia; 7-8" long and 4-6 mo old.
 - (4) D Co OPCON 1/69 conducts search and destroy missions QL 19.
- (5) Recon cont surveillance operations from the center of mass, grid 306544. Reports neg significant sightings or findings.

- (2) B Co cont the RIF along checkpoints 361551, 365553, 369558, 364561. 3/B at 385554 found 4 hootches 4x4x4' 1 week old, used by 2 indiv, also 2-1 man sleeping holes, 5x2x1', with neg O/H, 1 week d.d. 1/B at 359552 found 3 bunkers 0x8x3', 2' O/H, 1-2 days old, camouflaged with trees and brush. Also found barefoot tracks by 4-6 indiv, 1-2 days old. 2/B and CP at 358552 found 100 punji stakes 3 days old, (not placed), 3 crossbows, 8 animal pens, 4 pr
 Ho Chi Minh sandals, 20 baske s. Approx 35 indiv inhabi ed the area, 3-4 were in the area 1 day ago. B Co in vic 370557 found blood stained bamboo, 1 bunker 8x10' with 3' O/H used last night by an est 15-20 indiv, 1 hootch 4x4x4'. B Co(-) at 360558 found 18 hootches 5x8x5' to 10x12x5'; 9 sleepers 4x5x3' to 8x6x3' with 3' O/H, all critained sleeping mats. isc cages, taskets were found in the area.

 125m NW of this location, 25 green punji stakes were found 1 day old, (dest).

 1/ at 366557 found 9 hootshes 6x10x5'; 50 chickens, 20 cages; 1 crossbow; 4
- (3) C Co cont RIF in area bounded by checkpoints 300545, 302550, 300560, 297572. At 302553, 2/6 found 1 trail running E-W, 1½' wide, and not visible from the air. Trail had neg recent use.
 - (4) D Co OPCON to 1/35 Inf in a 2 Co operation vic BR4434. Conducted a CA from

bridge 26 to coor BR422347.

(5) Recon cont RIF along checkpoints 313562, 312570, 312579. Recon in vic found 1 spring type booby trap, 1 mo old on a trail running N-S 18" wide, not visible from the air, itswee-last usedwas undetermined. In the vic of 317568 Recon found 2 hootches 4x4x6' containing 600-700 lbs rice, (dest). At 317567 they found 2 hootches 8x8x6', containing 600 lbs of rice; 1 sleeping hootch 7x7x6'; and 20 pigs. Area last used 1-2 days ago by 2-3 people. (Rice destroyed.)

- 1. Operations Summary
- A. The 1/12 Inf cont opn PUTNAM SHARK, NW of Camp RADCLIFF.
- (1) A Co conducts airlift into LZ coor BR298567 and begins RIF to N along highground. 3/A at 302568 found 2 hootches 5x5x5', 3' off the ground, 1-2 mo old, last used 3 weeks ago by unknown number of indiv; inside found 250 lbs grain which was destroyed. 3/A vic 301572, found a grove of 50-75 banana trees, (dest). A Co at 297572 found 1 hootch 15x10x8' deep, 3' 0/H; 4 hootches 15x10x8' last used 3 wks to 1 mo ago by an undetermined number. 2/A and CP found 2 large sows and 12 pigs in a pen, area showed no recent use, (dest). 3/A at 299573 found 1 hootch 5x5x5' 3 weeks old; 5 baskets containing 100 lbs of rice, (dest). The area was last used 3 weeks ago by a small group. 3 EM sustained punji stakes wounds on the LZ and were dusted off.
- (2) B Co conducts RIF in area bounded by checkpoints 350570, 370570, 350558, 350558. At 369558 found 4 spear type booby traps, 2 on a N-S trail, 2 on an E-W trail. The traps were set-up in the last 2-3 days. Trails were 18" wide and not visible from the air. 1 EM received wound from a spear type booby trap and was due ed off.
- (3) C Co conducts air lift from PZ coor BR298567 to FSB WARRIOR and assumed mission of FSB security. Conducts local sweeps, LP's and maintains 3 ambushes, 324566, 327554, 314549. Reports neg significant sightings of contacts.
 - (4) D Co OPCON to 1/35 cont search and clear opns vic 450340.

- (5) Recon conducts RIF along checkpoints 313570, 315565, 321558, and closes on FSB WARRIOR. Reports neg significant sightings or findings.
