SUBJECT: Daily SITREP 115 for 250001H to 252400H February 1970.

- 1. (C) Operations Summary
- A. The 1/12 Inf cont opnsPUTNAM SHARK, N of Camp Radcliff.
- (1) A Co cont RIF in area bounded by checkpoints 520767, 530767, 530750, and 520750. At 526759 A Co found 1 set of motor cycle tracks along a well used trail, 5' wide and visible from the air.
- (2) B Co conducts RIF along checkpoints 570742, 578750, 590737, 583728.

  2/B at 575744 heard voices in an AZ of 025°, rng 100m; the scout dog alerted on an AZ of 290°. 1/B at 58373 found 1 bunker (10x5x3¹), 2¹ 0/H, used by 3 indiv about 7 mo ago; there was also a spear type booby trap, (5 mo old), and 2 empty bamboo baskets; all items destroyed. At 575744, 2/B found 3 hootches (4x5x5¹) made of bamboo, used by 6 indiv about 4 mo ago. Also found a trail running NE, 2¹ wide and not visible from the air. It was used by 6 indiv in the last 24H. 3/B at 576747 found 7 bunkers (4x5x6¹), 3¹ 6/H, last used 1 week ago; also 6 deep spider holes nearby; all were well camouflaged, all destroyed.
  - (3) C Co cont FSB security, maintains 3 ambushes and daily sweeps. Neg significant sightings or contact.
- (4) D Co w/ Recon attached, cont to exploit CL V cache, center of mass, grid 540753. 3/D at 547759 recieved 30 rds of S/A sniper fire from approx 50m N resulting in 1 US WIA, and 1 US KIA. The sqd was moving 100m down a trail, passing a small side trail, which they did not check and did not secure, when returning the enemy fired from the side trail hitting the 2

men, neg sighting. Village in gulley to the E of the trail; main trail SE to NW. The secondary was NE to SW, 1 other trail branches off to the cache.

- 1. (C) Operations Summary
- A. The 1/12 Inf cont opn FUTNAM SHARK, N of Camp RADCLIFF.
- (1) A Co conducts RIF in area of interest bounded by checkpoints 527772, 534763, 525750, 513750, 513760. At 524764 the 1st plat received AK-47 sniper fire from approx 100m to the west, there were at least 2 indiv wearing NVA bush hats, who fled SW. One US WIA, PFC Venskus received a rd through the wrist. A sweep of the area revealed a hootch, 12x20x10' 1 mo old; with a bunker underneath, 4x4'; used w/in the last 2 days, at 523762.
- (2) B Co conducts RIF along checkpoints 578744, 581749, 581755, 575758.

  2 & 3/B at 577749 a 20x10x15' rice field, used 1 mo ago, also a 1 man hootch (3x4x5') used 2-3 weeks ago; all was destroyed. B Co(-) vic 579748 found 2 spider holes, 6' deep, 1 bunker, 3x8x6' w/ 3½' O/H used by 4-5 indiv in the past mo.4t 580749, B Co(-) found a hole between 2 rocks, containing 2 jugs(2½' high) and 10 balls of yarn, used 3 weeks ago. 200m to the NE found a jug of rice wine. B Co(-) at 580749 found another bottle of rice wine; all was destroyed. In the same vic the element found a 1 man lean-to (3x4x6'), 2 mo old and a 5 gal jug of rice wine. This too was destroyed. Also found were 2 hootches, 3x4x5' used by 4 indiv in the last mo. There was also an old trail, last use 1 mo, 18" wide running N-S, and not visible from the air. At 580751 found a trail intersection which was not visible from the air, The trails were 18" wide, 1 running N-S, the other E=W, used

in the last 24H by 3-4 indiv. 1/B at 578742 heard tubes popping on an AZ 200°, rng 150m; also heard 10 rounds explode, (believed 60mm), AZ220-270° at rng 150m. R/L and 4.2" employed. B Co(-) at 572758, found 1 large hootch, (40x20x8') and 2 smaller hootches, (4x6x5'), 1 was sleeper and other for storage: 9-10 mo old, neg recent use. Vic 577753, found 10 hootches (42x5x41), leaf type, approx 3-4 wks old; 2 NVA latrines, and 5 bunkers in an area 25-100m from the hootches: last used this moring.

- (3) C Co cont FSB security, maintains 3 amb, and conducts daily security sweeps. Neg significant sightings or contacts.
- (4) D Co and Recon conduct RIF along checkpoints 541769, 554769, 554748, 541748. D Co(-) at 547765 found 4 rice storage hootches, (6x8x10'), 6' off the ground, contained 5-6 tons rice, in assorted containers, also found Montagnard beads and pliers.

SUBJECT: Daily SITREP 117 for 270001H to 272400H February 1970.

- 1. (C) Operations Summary
- A. The 1/12 Inf cont opn PUTNAM SHARK, N of Camp RADGLIFF.
- (1) A Co conducts RIF in area bounded by checkpoints 528774, 540774, 540774, 540774, 528754. At 523765 A Co found a hooteh, (15x29x10'), 4' off the ground with a bunker underneath, (3x4x5'), 1' O/H, used by 10 indiv approx 2 weeks ago; also a Chicom grenade rigged in explosive form for a booby trapabout 3 days ago, not set for trip. A Co in a 4x6x4' hole cavered with brush at 525764 found several B40 boxes containing: 1 new Chicom AM radio; 4 telephone switch boards 4 Chicom field telephones; 4 Chicom gren des; 1 cs(2-3000') of det cord; 6 cs cases blasting caps; 4-6000 rds SKS ammo; 2-3'82mm mortar primers. 1/A at 528758 found 24 B40 rds; 87 82mm mortar rds; and 12 60mm mortar rds on a pallet covered by a poncho. At their re-supply LZ A Co received 10-20 rds AK fire; the aircraft took several hits and the doorgunner was wounded. A Co also had 1 WIA
- (2) B Co 1st plat conducted RIF along checkpoints 580745; 580754; 572758 and joined 2 & # plat to establish a patrol base to receive the 4.2" plat, vic 572758. B Co(-)575757 heard metallic clicking and the dog was alerted while moving toward the hilltop; 2/B observed possible bunkers on hilltop and found several AP mines on this avenue of approach. 2/B located 5 AP mines, (size of large smoke grenade), at 573758, in the vic of an old FSB, the mines were running E to W. 1/B at 570756 near the blue line found 2 fresh fires and stockpens, as well as a hootch, (8x6x5') 1 mo old.
  - (3) C Co cont as FSB security, making daily sweeps and maintaining 3

ambushes. On the west side of the perimeter 3/C detected movement at AZ 300° rng 100-200m; at the sounds of breaking brush 3 M-79 rds and 1 Ill were emplement on an AZ 175° rng 30m described as the breaking brush.

- (4) D Co conducts RIF in area bounded by checkpoints 550774, 560774, 550754 and establishes night locations. 1/D at 545767 received S/A fire from the NW, approx 4-5 rds AK, the element returned fire on an AZ 350° rng 100m; the re-supply bird, Alligator 29, took several rounds, with neg friendly casualties. At 547765 D Co found 17 hootches, 2-3 mo old, (6x8x10¹), used by 4-6 indiv in the last 2 days; containing tons of rice; medical supplies, (bottles and cottn); 20 SKS rds; and roster type documents, with 2 Feb crossed off. 1/D at 550773 found 1000 lts of unpolished rice in 3 hootches, 6x8x10¹, approx 6 mo old w/ neg recent use.
- (5) Recon conducts RIF along checkpoints 547685, 543698, 539584 and establishes night ambushes. At 544685 Rcn found an old village of 8 hootches, 4 were 30x15x20' and 4 were 15x10x10'; with bunkers underneath, 4x5x6', 2' 6/H. One was used as a mess hall, and was large enough for 40-50 people; also found 1 coleman lantern; w/ fuel; 2 AK-47 magizines; 1 picture of Ho Chi Minh; assorted books and papers; 1 transistor radio; farm tools, saw, pik, shovel, 4 hoes; 1 piece of black and 1 piece of green cloth; 1 bag grain; and 1 bundle of bamboo. Also found was 100 lbs salt; and 7 pigs. At 537687 Recon detected movement at 20m, AZ 270°. A Claymore was fires and the movement ceased.
  - (6) The 4.2" platoon displaces from TOUGHIE to PB vic 572758.

- 1. (C) Operations Summary
- A. The 1/12 Inf cont opn PUTNAM SHARK, N of Camp RADCLIFF.
  - (1) A Co continues to develop area vic center of mass 518763.
- (2) B Co maintains hip shoot security vic 578758. Conducts local security and 1 plat size RIF along checkpoints 573768, 579765, 583765, 579754.
- (3) C Co maintains FSB security and conducts local security RIF's and establishes LP's.
- (4) D Co continues RIF in present AO bounded by checkpoints 550775, 560775, 560775, 560775, 560775. At 578771 D Co found 2 hootches, (6x8x10'), made of bamboo and sticks, built 6' off the ground, all destroyed. While resupplying D Co at 548771 Bikini Pink recieved S/A fire while lifting off the ground; a sweep located the SEL at 555771, where 1 indiv fired 25 AK rds and fled N. 25 expended AK rds were found.
- (5) Recon remains vic grid 537087 and establishes LP's. Reports neg significant sightings or contacts.
- (6) Bikini 20 received 2 rds in the tail near TOUGHIE when 30-49 rds of AC-47 were fired at it from the ridge line S of TOUGHIE. There were also several rds fired at TOUGHIE. S/A, R/L and MG fire was returned. Alligator 10 reported 2 new hootches 400-500m NNW of 572758 in a draw. Also reported due W of the above location, 500-1000m, a freshly plowed field and a new, very large hootch the field had a fence all around it.
